2024 was a reasonably good year for our church. We enjoyed 4 fund-raising events, St Peter's tide Cream Tea in June, BBQ in July, Harvest Lunch in October and finally our much supported Carols by Candlelight, candles being bought in memory of loved ones no longer with us. All events were well supported and as fund raisers help to keep our beautiful old church going. Like all organisations, it gets ever harder to meet our outgoings, so fund raising is a must, and we sincerely thank all who help church to meet its commitments. These four events will occur during 2025.

Our really big village service is always the Remembrance Service held on the green, and I can promise that after last year's difficult timing there will be amendments made to this.
