As everyone will have heard by now St Peter's Ilton has had an architect's report revealing that the building is in a poor state and needs major building repairs in order to save this ancient building.

Our Parish church in now on Historic England's Churches at Risk Register; although this is a sad position to be in it should help us when raising money through grants.

This has been due to neglect of the building over the years due to lack of funds and also repairs have been made with incorrect materials for an historic building. Now the diocese has a committee who vet all the applications for repairs to prevent this misuse, called the Diocesan Advisory Committee

Our present position is that we are having a meeting (in the Church) on <u>OCTOBER 19th</u> at 6.30pm and inviting everyone to attend.

There will be our architect present to explain building repair needs, someone from the diocese to explain the future vision and use of the church and someone to give a short talk on the history of the building itself, chaired by the Rector.

We need a project team to work, with help from the diocese, to find money from grants and project manage the work.

Isle Brewers have achieved this for their church which was nearly falling down and it is very beautiful and now worth a visit.

#### **Playing Field**

Much has been happening on the Playing Field; the path is finished, the benches have been installed and the football pitch is ready for playing. Wild flowers will be sown in a few locations to attract bees and insects.

#### **Grass Cutting**

The Parish Council would like to thank all the willing volunteers who have been busy cutting the grass all summer. The village is looking lovely at the moment. So thank you everyone for your hard work.

#### Dog poo on the Playing Field

Unfortunately there are still some people using the Field who are not picking up after their dog. Dog waste can spread toxicaria which causes blindness in humans. Children are particularly at risk. So please ensure you bag up after your dog and place it in one of the bins provided or take it back home with you. We hope to have another dog waste bin at the Willow Road entrance to the Field very soon.

#### Dogs on lead

Most people are sticking to the dogs on lead rule which we feel is important because there are many people who are uncomfortable around dogs. The Field is a community area and must be open to all including those who may be afraid of dogs. So please do keep your dog on a lead. The Council considered a recent

suggestion to have a fenced off area for dogs to run free but it was felt that this could become contaminated with faeces if not everyone picks up after their dog, and this would be a potential health risk for our volunteer grass cutting team.

#### **Brook Green**

For those people who want to give their dog a good run off the lead, Brook Green is a large semi wild area with no livestock and no restrictions on dogs running free. It is close to the village at the end of Rod Lane. There are picnic benches, trees and a stream running through this lovely wooded common. Please use this area if you wish to exercise your dog off the lead.

#### War Memorial and Remembrance Day

Despite losing men in both the first and second world wars, Ilton has never had a War Memorial. This will now change. The Parish Council have commissioned a wooden War Memorial, helped by a donation from Larkfleet Homes. This will be placed on the Village Green in time for Remembrance Sunday in November. There will also be silhouettes and name plaques for all the men lost in both wars, plus the airmen lost just after the war who are buried in Ilton Cemetery. We are arranging a Service of Remembrance on the Village Green for **Sunday, 14th November** at 10.30am followed by 2 minutes silence at 11am, also on the village green.
